
Johnston, Donald MacDuff

cancer.



Donald was born May 21, 1924 in Providence, Rhode Island to the late Bertram Johnston and Zella (MacDuff) Mann. married Harbara Mitchell on July 13, 1952 at Harvard University's Appleton Chapel in Cambridge, Massachusetts. He had attended Duke University for one year in 1942-43 and then, after the war, earned degree from lege in busia bachelor's deg Bowdoin College administration. was employed as a sales distributor for Link Belt Corporation in Boston, Massachusetts and Mil-waukee for 25 years. He then worked for Badger Bearing Company in Mil-waukee before opening his own business, Don John-ston Inc., in Wisconsin Register activing in 1984 ston Inc., in Wiscons Rapids, retiring in 1984.

Donald served his country for two years as an Army paratrooper in the 82nd Airborne Division in WWII where he jumped on D-Day in Normandy landing him behind enemy lines. Of the 41 men in his unit he was one of the 22 survivors. He also received the Bronze Star for his distinguished military service. The citation accompanying his medal read: "Donald M. Johnston, 3136160, Private, 508th Parachute Infantry. For heroic conduct in action on 3 July 1944, west of La Haye Du Puits, France. When his battalion was attempting to secure high ground west of La Haye Du Puits, Pri-



vate Johnston, Rifleman in Company "A", 508th Parachute Infantry, voluntarily moved to a position behind a house where enemy troops were endeavoring to set up a strong point. They immediately directed heavy machine gun and rifle fire against him. In spite of that fire, he delivered such effective rifle fire that the enemy was unable to establish this position, which would have held up the battalion attack and inflicted heavy casualties in our troops." Additionally, he received a Purple Heart and participated in the Battle of the

Bulge.
Don was an avid championship golfer, enjoyed hunting, woodworking, cooking and loved to work in his yard. He was a WWII historian of sorts and often talked to groups and individuals about his experience as a paratrooper. In September of 2009 he traveled back to France to visit the site of his jump in Normandy with the help of historian/author Dominique Francois. Then in April, 2010, he traveled on one of the first Honor Flights to Washington, D.C., where he visited the WWII War Memorial.

Donald is survived by his wife Barbara; son Brian MacDuff Johnston of Pewaukee, Wisconsin; daughter Lynn (Dan) Kirkbride of Chugwater, Wyoming; grandchildren Hannah (Thomas) Kraner, Jeremy (Tara) Westerman, Abby (Ben) Rasmussen, Mitchell Westerman, Charles MacDuff Westerman and one great-grandchild Beck William Wester-

man.

He was preceded in death by his parents and brother Gordon Johnston.
